In the stillness of the mountain, the little things add up. Word by word, poems are crafted. Sentence by sentence, short stories take shape. Note by note, orchestrations emerge. Stroke by stroke, brushes create walls of color. In the Artists' Barn, on the decks of the Artists' House, in the solitude of the Old Barn, under

the solar panels of The Middlebrook Studios, artists do what they do best -- they observe, they reflect, they create.

The little things around them do not go unnoticed. The red-shouldered hawk swoops on an unsuspecting rabbit. Twig by twig the swallows build their nests. Delicate velvet grows on antlers. Inch by inch, banana slugs move. The fog ebbs and flows revealing and hiding the ocean. The wind blows and branches fall.

Staff has a role in all this creative work as well. Many are artists themselves. They wash sheets, chop vegetables, dig drainage dishes, organize sculpture hikes, capture misguided snakes and pick up mail.

The gift of time has many enablers here at Djerassi. We have 82 artists this year-selected from 847 applicants -- who are worthy of YOUR support. They are here for 30 sunrises and sunsets. They tell us this time informs their life's work in unexpected ways.

Local Award

Menlo Park's prominent local newspaper, The

Smile - or is it Fast Forward?

During his session, Cameron Hockenson (2013) cut giant 'fast forward, play and pause' symbols into the hills around the ranch. Then, Cameron put in a request to Google Earth to notify him when they published new satellite images of the Djerassi hillsides. As a satellite has photographed Djerassi, there are new images of his work. Symbolic of both our technological civilization and the ephemeral nature of sculptures at the artists' ranch, the 'crop circles' themselves are now disappearing. Captured by satellite, however, they remain preserved in time.

Pat Montley (2005, 2013) has been awarded a \$10,000 grant from the Greater Baltimore Cultural Alliance to finish writing the play she was working on at Djerassi. Scheduled for production in the spring of 2015 is a reading of *Pope Joan II*, about an American nun who becomes Pope (could this be 'In the heels of the Fisherman?). More.

A resident in 2013, **Boris Fishman's** new novel, *A Replacement Life*, debuts June 3, published by HarperCollins and available online as well. In her comments on the book, Joyce Carol Oates said, "A Replacement Life is a memorable debut by a

wonderfully gifted young writer...Boris Fishman has written a beautifully nuanced, tender, and often very funny novel about conscience and familial loyalty that will linger long in the memory." In addition to novelist, Boris has followed a career as a journalist and a contributor to The New Yorker. More.

Cheryl Lu-Lien Tan (2012) will be feted at a special evening by the Consul-General of Singapore on June 10 in San Francisco. The event celebrates her newly edited book *Singapore Noir*, a collection of crime and mystery fiction. Part of the long-running Noir series by publisher Akashic Books, the new work contains dark-side tales from a land that maintains a reputation as a modern society with law-and-order stability. Cheryl's assemblage presents a slightly different view. Read more.


